Directions for project

1. Make a Revolutionary War museum display. You can pick a topic that relates to the revolutionary war, like women in the war, spies of the war or important battles of the war. Read/research using at least 2 resources. Please keep track of your resources and list them on your display using the **easybib.com** website.
2. Make a replica of a 3 D object or artifact that was important during the Revolutionary War. ****If you make or draw weapons please get permission from your teacher before you bring the item to school.**

Draw a portrait of a famous person, an important scene from history, or maybe an important item. Please do your best work because this will be displayed in your museum. Make a tag to attach to your picture and a note card.

Explain your picture to your classmates. What is the picture showing? Why was it important to your colonial settlement? (Criteria: At least 5 facts on each notecard.)

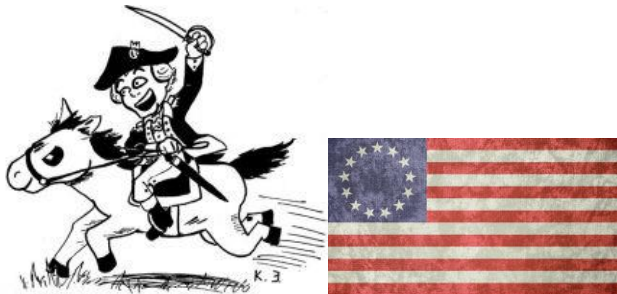
